


Conservation Through Education

Introduction

A Conservation District is a legal subdivision of state government, responsible under state law for conservation work within its boundaries. Self-government is the guiding philosophy of Conservation Districts. Decisions about conservation issues are made at the local level by citizens who understand and want to protect and improve their local environment.

Pennsylvania has 66 Conservation Districts, one in each county except Philadelphia.

Each District is governed by a volunteer Board of Directors appointed by their local governing bodies, such as County Commissioners. Conservation Districts provide the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP), Pa. Dept. of Agriculture (PDA) and Dept. of Conservation and Natural Resources (DCNR) a way to implement a wide variety of environmental programs that best serve the agricultural, suburban and urban interests of their counties.

The success of Conservation Districts is due in part to their ability to successfully work with local, state and federal agencies and private organizations.

Pennsylvania's Conservation Districts are a model of effective government and among the most diverse, capable and active in the nation.

The Monroe County Conservation District (MCCD or District) has historically adhered to the goals and objectives determined by our Board of Directors, partnering agencies, and the community at large. In 2020, it was decided that the District would establish a formal Strategic Planning Group in order to better support the citizens of Monroe County and continue to act as regional stewards for the county's natural resources.

2021-2022 Planning Process

The Monroe County Conservation District engaged the services of Peter Wulfhorst, Extension Educator, Penn State Extension to facilitate the development of the Monroe County Conservation District Strategic Plan. The District in collaboration with Penn State Extension conducted several surveys to engage Board, staff and the stakeholders. A Board & Staff survey was conducted to gauge the relationship between the staff and the Board.

In addition, as part of the development of the Strategic Plan, stakeholders were surveyed to assist the MCCD in identifying the needs of the residents, the important natural resource issues that they are concerned about and the types of programs and activities that will enhance the District's ability to meet these needs and issues including the Kettle Creek Environmental Center (KCEE). The stakeholders included cooperating agencies, local government officials, environmental organizations, educational groups and the general public. The MCCD wanted to understand how the district can best serve the needs of our community and conserve our natural resources.

The survey resulted in a list of critical environmental issues to attempt to address through the Strategic Plan.

The first strategic planning meeting was conducted virtually on January 26, 2021. The meeting consisted of an organizational assessment, project activity assessment and review of organizational survey.

The second strategic planning meeting was conducted face to face on June 4, 2021, which consisted of a SWOT (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Threats) analysis, draft Mission Statement and a discussion of draft Goals.

A targeted meeting called "Monroe in Focus": Community & Economic Leaders focus group was conducted face to face on July 15, 2021. The audience consisting of local municipal officials, professional engineers, developers and other members of the land development regulated community in Monroe County provided their input on the goals and objectives for the Monroe County Conservation District Strategic Plan.

The third strategic planning meeting conducted on September 13, 2021, resulted in the Mission Statement and a set of Goals & Objectives. Subsequent meetings conducted on October 14, 2021, and internal staff meetings on November 30, December 2 & December 9, 2021 resulted in Action Steps for the Goals & Objectives.

All strategic planning meetings other than the internal staff meetings were attended by MCCD Staff & Board members, cooperating agencies, environmental organizations, DEP, NRCS & Local Schools.

The MCCD obtained partial funding from the State Conservation Commission's (SCC) Leadership Development Program to help implement the strategic planning process and develop the 2022 Strategic Plan. The SCC funding was used to retain a facilitator to assist in the public planning session and to further the development of strategic plan goals and strategies as identified.

Critical Natural Resource Issues

The Monroe County District Strategic Planning stakeholder survey revealed the most important critical natural resources issues. A total of 124 individuals completed the survey. The following items were identified:

- Water Quality/Protection
- Land Use
- Invasive Species
- Stormwater Management
- Forestry Management
- Climate Change

A second survey question asked "What should Monroe County Conservation District prioritize in order to manage the natural resources in the county?

This question revealed the priorities the District should focus on and is reflected in the Goals & Objectives of the strategic plan.

- Protect Surface Water Quality such as streams, lakes, wetlands, etc.
- Provide Environmental Education to the community
- Control soil erosion and the resulting sediment pollution
- Provide education and outreach to government officials
- Assisting landowners with natural resource conservation
- Increase involvement with municipal stormwater ordinance

The critical natural resource issues and needs as identified through the public planning process were considered by the Board within the context of the District's Mission. Several guiding principles became evident through the issues/needs assessment. These guiding principles laid the framework for the District's Vision for the Future and for development of the five Long-Range Goals which will help the District implement our Programs and Mission and achieve our Vision.

Environmental Education Issues

In addition, there was a question in the survey pertaining to the MCCD Environmental Education programming - What target audiences do you believe Kettle Creek Environmental Education Center should be focusing their programming?

The top 3 audiences were Young Adults Ages 13-19, Children Ages 7-12 and Adults.

A 2nd question concerning the MCCD Environmental Education programming asked What program updates would you like to see be made available at Kettle Creek?

The survey respondents felt that Online program registration and Virtual programming with Online gift shop/ bird supplies a distant third.

These survey questions and responses were reflected in the Strategic Plan Goals & Objectives.

Monroe County Conservation District Mission

The Monroe County Conservation District recognizes that our quality of life is directly related to the quality and integrity of our natural resources. Our mission is to maintain, protect, and restore the natural resources of Monroe County through science-based education, partnerships, and advocacy

Priority Determination & Resource Review

The planning group, containing members of the public and our partners, discussed current and developing issues the District is facing. Through multiple in-person and virtual interactions, the group was able to focus on determining the strengths the District needs to better capitalize on and possible improvements that can be made in the future to better serve the citizens of Monroe County.

The identification of the key issues affecting the District was derived through a SWOT (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities, and Threats) analysis. The SWOT analysis also utilized the initial public survey as the framework for conversation, as they were all representatives of different stakeholder groups. This process allowed the planning group to outline what existing resources existed within the District and how to better prioritize these resources based off of community needs. The results of the SWOT analysis were used to determine the Strategic Plan goals.

Strategic Planning will occur, district-wide, every 5 years or as needed.
