

#### **PURPOSE**

In an attempt to instill in our youth a positive conservation ethic and an increased awareness of our environment, the Monroe County Federation of Sportsmen's Clubs and the Monroe County Conservation District sponsor the Monroe County Conservation Camp along with generous support by the Kettle Creek Environmental Fund and numerous service organizations.

Each summer, this week-long, activity filled, residential camp gives 30 students, ages 14 to this year's high school graduate, the opportunity to work with experts from throughout the county and fellow campers to gain insight into our natural resources and their proper management. #### REGISTRATION FEES

Many individuals and organizations come together each year to make Conservation Camp a reality. The many generous donations of supplies, money and time allow us to keep the cost for the week to a minimum.

The present cost for the week is \$200 per camper, which is made up of a \$75 application fee and a \$125 camp fee. The application fee must be paid by the student and must accompany the completed application form. The \$125 camp fee may be paid either by the student or a sponsoring organization, or through a scholarship. A number of scholarships are available every year upon request.

#### REQUIREMENTS

#### The Students Must:

- 1. Be between ages 14 and this year's high school graduate
- 2. Have completed all sections of the application and secured a parent or guardian's signature.
- 3. Submit a letter with the application form stating why they want to attend camp. Attendance at camp is limited to 30 students.
- 4. Send all application materials to the Monroe County Conservation District. Applications will be accepted up to 11 months in advance, however camper availability will be determined on a first-come, first-served basis after June 1 until registration limit is met each year.
- 5. Only applications from FIRST TIME campers will be accepted.
- 6. Provide any and all necessary equipment.
- 7. Campers are Required to attend the whole week of camp Saturday to Saturday.
