

Capture Adventure at Conservation Camp!



For the past 48 years, the Monroe County Conservation District along with Monroe County Sportsmen's clubs have held an outdoor camp for teenagers. This camp is truly a unique experience which has exposed over 1,200 teenagers to the outdoor world and all its resources. We feel the camp creates an environment where every camper can participate in numerous outdoor activities while being a part of a group of 30 teenagers plus staff.

Campers from past years have commented on being a little uncertain when first arriving at camp but by the end of the week they considered it one of the best experiences ever. We strive to make the camp a positive experience for all participants and we feel the campers not only learn about the outdoors from many professionals in the field but also learn a little more about themselves along the way.

Activities include programs on natural history, wildlife management, water quality, archery, trap shooting, a high adventure ropes course and a two-day canoe trip on the Delaware River. Each activity is led by professionals in the field and is designed to be both informative and enjoyable. The camp is held at Stony Acres, an East Stroudsburg

THE 42ND ANNUAL CHRISTMAS BIRD COUNT

On December 18, 2022, twenty-eight volunteers spent a total of 62 hours scouring the Poconos for birds as part of the National Audubon Society's Christmas Bird Count. The CBC is the oldest citizen science effort in the world. This year, the Pocono Mountain count circle added a total of 3891 birds of 58 different species.

Highlights included a record number of hooded mergansers, a great blue heron and a fox sparrow. Although there were no firsts for the count circle black vultures had another spectacular showing of 64 individuals. Given that there were none ever recorded in the first three decades of effort it is a clear signal that the climate is changing. Another sign being detected by efforts like the CBC is the black-capped chickadee. For decades this species always outnumbered those of the tufted titmouse. For the second season in a row the titmouse count has exceeded that of the chickadee. In the southern portion of the black-capped chickadees range there is competition with the Carolina chickadee. Where the two species intermingle hybridization is occurring as the Carolina chickadees range expands northward due to habitat suitability brought on by climate change. We know that Carolina chickadees have reached the south side of the Kittatinny Ridge in Northampton County, where active hybridization between the two species is being monitored by Dr. Amber Rice and her grad students at Lehigh University. Her research shows that most of the hybrid eggs are infertile and never hatch leading to decline in the population. There is some evidence that things are not yet suitable for Carolina chickadees north of the Kittatinny in the Poconos, although they have already crossed the ridge to our southwest. Perhaps our efforts during the PM CBC are showing the vanguard of Carolina chickadee incursion. This is something that bears monitoring in the future.

We want to thank all the volunteers for their continued efforts to keep this important work going. The 43rd annual Pocono Mountain Christmas Bird Count will be held on Sunday December 17, 2023. Mark it on your calendars now so you don't miss out on being part of this worthwhile effort, and all of the fun of course.
